

"The man who attempts to keep the commandments of God from a sense of obligation merely—because he is required to do so—will <u>never</u> enter into the joy of obedience. <u>He does not obey. When the requirements of God are accounted a burden because they cut across human inclination, we may know that the life is not a Christian life. True obedience is the outworking of a principle within. It springs from <u>the love of righteousness</u>, the <u>love of the law of God</u>. The essence of all righteousness <u>is loyalty to our Redeemer</u>. This will lead us to do right <u>because</u> it is right—because right doing <u>is pleasing to God</u>. COL p-97"</u>

John 14:15 If ye love me, keep my commandments.

John 14:21 He that <u>hath my commandments</u>, <u>and keepeth them</u>, <u>he it is that loveth me</u>: and he that <u>loveth me</u> shall be loved <u>of</u> my Father, <u>and I will</u> love him, and <u>will manifest myself</u> <u>to him.</u>

John 14:23 Jesus answered and said unto him, <u>If a man love me, he will keep my words</u>: and <u>my Father will love him, and we will come unto him, and make our abode with him.</u>
John 14:24 He that <u>loveth me not keepeth not my sayings</u>: and the word which ye hear <u>is not mine</u>, but the Father's which sent me.

"As the result of active faith in Christ, we are brought into the moral warfare with the world, the flesh, and the Devil. If we undertake this warfare in our own wisdom, our human ability, we shall certainly be overcome; but if we exercise living faith in Jesus, and practice godliness, we shall understand what it means to be sanctified through the truth, and we shall not be overcome in the conflict, for heavenly angels encamp around about us. Christ is the Captain of our salvation. He it is who strengthens his followers for the moral conflict which they are pledged to undertake. RH June 28, 1892, par 4

"But if the love of the world, if self-esteem, or any defiling thoughts or actions, obtain the victory over us, then shall we lose confidence in Jesus, or in ourselves? <u>Is it because Jesus failed us, and did not supply us with his grace?—No; it is because we did not do what the Lord has told us to do</u>, Watch unto prayer; "Pray always;" "Pray without ceasing." How can your soul be in health, when you shut yourself away from prayer, and have no connection with Christ, the source of all spiritual light and life and power? We must have a constant connection with Christ; for he is our sustenance. He is that bread which came down from heaven. Then let us be doers of his word, and we shall have spiritual life and power. <u>We must place ourselves often before God as suppliants, because prayer brings the soul into immediate contact with God through Jesus Christ.</u> He is the Way, the Truth, and the Life. If a Christian fails, it is because he does not obey the orders of his Captain. He is off guard; he is not Christ-like. It will work disaster to the soul to neglect prayer; for you will be led to yield carelessly to temptation. But if you do yield, do not therefore cast away your confidence in God; <u>lose confidence in yourself, and press closer to the side of Christ</u>. RH June 28, 1892, par 5

"Christ is not to be charged with the results of the negligence and indecision of man. He

who gave his life to save fallen man, appreciates the value of the soul. He will never fail of doing his part, nor become discouraged. He will never leave the erring one, tempted and tried in the conflict. "My grace is sufficient for thee." "God is faithful, who will not suffer you to be tempted above that ye are able." He weighs and measures every trial before he permits it to come. RH June 28, 1892, par 6

"God can never be charged as unjust because he does not send assistance to men; <u>but on</u> <u>the part of the one assailed by temptation there is a negligence to appropriate the freely offered aid.</u> If they had trusted Christ, he would have proved an all-sufficient Saviour, and it is through conflict that the spiritual life is strengthened. We are not left alone, but we are to seek help where it will surely be found. <u>RH June 28, 1892, par 7</u>

"The opposition we meet may prove a benefit to us in many ways. If it is well borne, it will develop virtues which would never have appeared if the Christian had nothing to endure. And faith, patience, forbearance, heavenly mindedness, trust in Providence, and genuine sympathy with the erring, are the results of trial well borne. These are the graces of the Spirit, which bud, blossom, and bear fruit amid trials and adversity. Meekness, humility, and love always grow on the Christian tree. If the word is received into good and honest hearts, the obdurate soul will be subdued, and faith, grasping the promises, and relying upon Jesus, will prove triumphant. "This is the victory that overcometh the world, even our faith." RH June 28, 1892, par 8

"He who opens the Scriptures, and feeds upon the heavenly manna, becomes a partaker of the divine nature. He has no life or experience apart from Christ. He hears the voice of God speaking from heaven, "This is my beloved Son, in whom I am well pleased." That voice is assurance to him that he is accepted in the Beloved. And he knows that in character he must be like him with whom God is well pleased. God has fully accepted Christ as our substitute, our surety; then let every one who names the name of Christ depart from all iniquity, and be one with Christ in character, that Jesus may not be ashamed to call us brethren. He in whom we trust has proved himself a present help in every time of need; and as we dwell with him, we grow more and more into his image. "We all, with open face beholding as in a glass the glory of the Lord, are changed into the same image, from glory to glory [which means from character to character], even as by the Spirit of the Lord." "For God who commanded the light to shine out of darkness, hath shined in our hearts, to give the light of the knowledge of the glory of God in the face of Jesus Christ." RH June 28, 1892, par 9

If we bear much fruit to the glory of God, our souls must be absorbed in meditating upon the glorious truths of the word of God. "It is the Spirit that quickeneth; the flesh profiteth nothing: the words that I speak unto you, they are spirit, and they are life." **RH June 28, 1892, par 10** 



# add to your faith... Virtue 2 Peter 1:5-7



"How are we to advance spiritually? is the question of greatest importance. How may we know individually that God is in us of a truth? When we individually receive the earnest of the inheritance; when we are individually led by the Spirit of God, and walk in all humility of mind; when we walk in love as dear children with subdued heart, crying unto God, Teach me Thy way; when we listen for every whisper of the Holy Spirit, the Lord will carry our minds to a higher, holier standard, where self is merged in Christ. There are two classes of persons whose example is profitable to this world. It is <u>not enough</u> to receive <u>the theory</u> of the truth. It is to be planted in the heart of teachers as well as students. It is to control <u>the mind</u> and regulate <u>the affections</u>. Take the truth from the sacred pages where God Himself has placed it, <u>and eat it as the bread of life.</u>

<u>Stamp the whole character with its divine utterances</u>. Its deep meaning is to be searched out. When the Word of God is eaten, its life-giving power is seen in the assimilation of the truth. Every jot and tittle is brought into the daily practice. This we all need to do. <u>13 LtMs, Ms</u> <u>83, 1898, par 6</u>



"A union with Christ by living faith is enduring; every other union must perish. Christ

first chose us, paying an infinite price for our redemption; and the true believer chooses Christ as first and last and best in everything. But this union costs us something. It is a union of utter dependence, to be entered into by a proud being. All who form this union must feel their need of the atoning blood of Christ. They must have a change of heart. They must submit their own will to the will of God. There will be a struggle with outward and internal obstacles. There must be a painful work of detachment as well as a work of attachment. Pride, selfishness, vanity, worldliness—sin in all its forms—must be overcome if we would enter into a union with Christ. The reason why many find the Christian life so deplorably hard, why they are so fickle, so variable, is that they try to attach themselves to Christ without first detaching themselves from these cherished idols. 5T p-231; MYP p-118; RH, December 13, 1887, par-11

After the union with Christ has been formed, it can be preserved only by earnest prayer and untiring effort. We must resist, we must deny, we must conquer self. Through the grace of Christ, by courage, by faith, by watchfulness, we may gain the victory. <u>5T p-231; MYP p-118</u>; RH, December 13, 1887, par-12.

"Believers become one in Christ, but one branch cannot be sustained by another. The nourishment must be obtained through the vital connection with the vine. We must feel our utter dependence on Christ. We must live by faith on the Son of God. That is the meaning of the injunction: "Abide in Me." The life we live in the flesh is not to the will of men, not to please our Lord's enemies, but to serve and honor Him who loved us and gave Himself for us. A mere assent to this union, while the affections are not detached from the world, its pleasures and its dissipations, only emboldens the heart in disobedience. <u>5T p-231; MYP p-118; RH, December 13, 1887, par-13.</u> (Read on in the RH article .... "touch of faith"..... "living faith".

"Love <26> is the <u>basis of godliness</u>. Whatever the profession, <u>no</u> man has pure love to God <u>unless</u> he has unselfish love for his brother. <u>But we can never come into possession of this spirit by trying to love others. What is needed is the love of Christ in the heart. When <u>self is merged in Christ, love springs forth spontaneously. The completeness of Christian character is attained when the impulse to help and bless others springs constantly from <u>within—</u> when the sunshine of heaven <u>fills the heart</u> and is revealed in the countenance. COL p-384</u></u>

**1a.** Why should a person learn to <u>Biblically fear God</u>? (Revelation 14:7-The answer is in the text or passage) <u>"Fear God"</u>, look up multi-faceted definitions, "<u>and give glory to Him</u>", look up multi-faceted definitions. God's Glory is His character and how He treats people-Exodus 31;12-Exodus 34:8; Matthew 5:16; 1<sup>st</sup> Peter 2:1-12; Matthew 25:31-40; Luke 10:25-37.

**2a**. "<u>For the hour of his judgment is come</u>":- Revelation 11:15-18; Malachi 3:13-18; Luke 12:31-40; Matthew 25:14-16; Ecclesiastes 3:14-17; Ecclesiastes 12:13-14; Daniel 7:9-14; Hosea 14;9; Matthew 7:12-27; Revelation 20:12-15; Matthew 22:1-14.

Biblically fearing God by choice on our part is a necessary part that allows Christ to get us ready for the Judgment of Salvation and Sealing, and Heaven, or if refusing to Biblically fear God and refusing to be lead by God, assigns us into the Judgment of Rejection, many are called , but due to their attitude and works or their lack, few are chosen.

A contrite heart and mind plus coming to Jesus giving Him Willing obedience from the heart gives Jesus an open door to continue His work of rescuing the person from the inside and out.

A Gospel calling of all, but a Gospel choosing of few, is shown in Matthew 13:36-52. The symbolic "fish" the gospel are netting are kept (sealed) or cast away(blotted out of the Book of Life) according to Matthew 13:36-52. (But how was the bad fish verses the good fish known from each other and seperated, since the parable is literally talking about human people?) (By the record of their character and works/fruit - retained or blotted out - Psalms 69:16-28; Psalms 73:1-27 notice verse 17 they are discovered known and rewarded or condemned by their page / video in Heaven's Sanctuary records.

- **3a.** "And worship him that made Heaven and Earth the Sea and Fountains of waters. Believe the Creator's story of Earth's origins of Genesis chapters 1-3. Disbelieve Satan's story of the Universe's origins and Earth's later evolution. Because Satan builds the false narrative of a false infrastructure of a false GodHead with Himself as the Most High God. Isaiah 14:4-22; Ezekiel 28:1-19; Worship the Creator as His creation Redemption Commemoration Ten Commandment Law says Exodus 20:8-11; Exodus 31:13-17; Revelation 14:7; Ezekiel 20:3-44; notice verses 12-14.
- **4a.** Respect and obey God's gender roles and marriage covenant created from Eden-Romans 1:16-32. Worshipping the Creator as he specifies, obeying His laws, protects the human mind and safeguards gender roles and marriage and the family structure and well being-Genesis 18;17-33 notice verse 19.
- **2.** What does the Bible say fearing God is or is not ? (main definition-Law of First Mention-Learning God's <theos-Theology> belief system, <Ethos-ethics, morals> the way God lives and acts, thinks and feels, <D'etre> The way God is, What He is made of, stands for, partnership union communion with God and God with man, surrender, obedience, prayer, words and natures abiding within. Getting as close to God as possible, agreeing with God, obeying God, taking in God's character and reflecting God's character and partaking of God's nature Deuteronomy 10:12-13 ).

Where does the Bible define FEARING GOD? Texts, phrases, Bible biographies. Using a Strong's Exhaustive Concordance, or good Bible software, look up fear\*, and phrases referring to God and fear\*, Lord fear\*, the \* is a wildcard and allows for any conjugation of the word either as a prefix(before the word) or a suffix(after the word). 463+190 = 653 un-winnowed texts. 653 texts gives a picture greatly exceeding traditional cliches, and context and content of Revelation 14:6 shows that all forms of obediently fearing God and Christ are a large part Heaven's prescribed preparations for pardon and acquittal in the Judgement. And the lack there of, (of fearing God and Christ) becomes the foundation evidence of rejecting Christ and cause of condemnation and guilty verdict in the judgment. Jesus Christ honors human best efforts to obey and adds His perfecting merits and the indwelling Holy Spirit.

#### Acts 5:

- 30 The God of our fathers raised up <u>Jesus</u>, whom ye slew and hanged on a tree.
- 31 Him hath God exalted with his right hand to be <u>a Prince and a Saviour</u>, for to give <u>repentance</u> to Israel, and <u>forgiveness of sins</u>.
- 32 And we are his witnesses of these things; and so is also the **Holy Ghost, whom God hath given to them that obey him.**

Hebrews 5: 5 So also <u>Christ glorified</u> not himself to be made an high priest; but he that said unto him, <u>Thou art my Son, to day have I begotten thee</u>.

- 6 As he saith also in another place, Thou art a priest for ever after the order of Melchisedec.
- 7 Who in the days of his flesh, when he had offered up prayers and supplications with strong crying and tears unto him that was able to save him from death, and was heard in that he feared:
- 8 Though he were a Son, yet learned he obedience by the things which he suffered;
- 9 And being made perfect, He became **the author** of eternal salvation unto all **them that obey him**;

Matthew 7:21 Not every one that saith unto me, <u>Lord</u>, <u>Lord</u>, shall enter into the kingdom of heaven; <u>but he that doeth the will of my Father which is in heaven.</u>

- 22 Many will say to me in that day, **Lord**, **Lord**, have we not prophesied in thy name? and in thy name have cast out devils? and in thy name done many wonderful works?
- 23 And then will I profess unto them, I never knew you: depart from me, ye that work iniquity.

(Bible Biographies connected with Bible texts, words, phrases, passages connected to Fearing God.)-examples- (Not Fearing God - Disobeying God) - Abraham sees no fear of God in the people of the land and loses his faith in God's protection and lies twice about his wife says she was only his sister <Genesis 12:10-20; Genesis 20:1-18>; Examples of (obedience Fearing God) Hebrew Midwives in Exodus story of Moses Birth and, deliverance < Exodus 1:8-Exodus 2:10>; Moses giving First Mention definition of Fearing God <Deuteronomy 10: 12-Deuteronomy 11:1>; King David equating being a just ruler due to Fear of God <2nd Samuel 23:1-3>; Remember love obey respect consequences < Leviticus 19:3, 14, 26-32>; Being taught to do right to fear God <Joshua 24:1-15; 1st Samuel 12:14-15; Psalms 34:1-22>; Fearing the True and Living God and false gods at the same time + reformation efforts <2nd Kings 17:1-41>; Story of Job whom God called perfect three times <Book of Job>; How Jesus Himself lived on Earth Fearing to come short of God's expectations because of Love for His Father and Heaven's Truth and How Jesus Christ feared God His Father and His prayers were heard because of it <Hebrews 4:1- through - Hebrews 5:10>.

#### Steps to ascertain true meanings of Biblical Fearing God and Christ-

Looking at the context of the text, verse, passage, chapter, and the word or phrase that contains the word translated fear\*; and looking at the sum of the texts, verses, passages, chapters or phrases that contains the word translated fear\*; and if the conclusion obeys the Scripture admonition and mission of fear\* being referred to at that reference to fear\*.

Biblically fearing The Most High God and the Lord God, or disobeying involves: and is not limited to:

(Behaviours both physical & mental / spiritual-Job 28:28; proverbs 3:7 & 8:13 & 16:6)

(speaking - Malachi 3:16-18; Matthew 12:22-37)

(teaching- Deuteronomy 4:10; Psalms 25:12; Psalms 34:11; Psalms 86:11)

(Mercy upon the merciful- Hosea 2:23; Matthew 5:7; Romans 11:31; 1<sup>st</sup> timothy 1:13 and verse 16; Hebrews 4:16; 1<sup>st</sup> Peter 2:10)

(Thoughts and feelings ='s Moral Ethical Character and imaginations/imaginings, plans, intentions, decisions, beliefs, opinions, attitudes) - Proverbs 23:7; Genesis 6:5; Jeremiah 6:15; Jeremiah 8:12; 1<sup>st</sup> Chronicles 28:9; 1<sup>st</sup> Kings 8:61; 2<sup>nd</sup> Chronicles 16:9; Psalms 101:6; Matthew 5:22; Leviticus 19:18; Zechariah 8:17; Matthew 5:43-48; Mark 12:28-33.

Two kinds of Fear of God - or their ideas of God, even if their ideas of God violate Scripture.

**1.** <u>Biblically Fearing God</u> - due to agape Love-like Jesus has toward God His Father < <u>Hebrews 5:5-10</u> > Loving Father God, and Heaven's absolute Truth more than life.;

#### Seeking to learn God's ethics and morals and ways, teachings, commands and obey with

<u>love and faith and please God</u> - O.T. Example - Deuteronomy 10:12-13,16,19-20; Deuteronomy 11:1, 8,13, 16-22, 26-28; Deut ch's 12 & 13 stewardship tithe offerings laws/commands, health laws/commands given, refuse abominations, reject false inspiration, obey all God's commands; - N.T. example - Matthew 10:25-42; Mark 6:17-20; Luke 1:41-55; Luke 12:1-59(here in Luke chapter 12 Jesus reveals the very nature of fearing God due to love and faith); Luke 23:33-47> (mercy from Jesus extended to the thief who confessed Jesus as his Lord while everyone else was mocking Jesus.)

<u>2. Fear of punishment</u>. < <u>Jonah 1:1-16</u> > - terrified pagan sailors - afraid of Jonah's God and invisible vengeance, following them punishing them for casting Jonah overboard and causing Jonah apparently to die for disobeying his God. Self serving, fire escape, self protection religion, lacking self forgetful love of Heaven's absolute Truth more than life.

(Condensed tutorial - to Biblically fear God ) - Hebrews 5;7 - He ( Jesus Christ, ISSA, ISA, Yeshua ) prayed and His prayers were heard and answered by the Most High God, because He feared/loved/obeyed God sinlessly, perfectly righteously; due to Scripture and Father God's and the Holy Spirit's and Holy Angels influence and keeping power and leading His life and His responding attitude of always seeking to please Father God . He was never afraid of His Father the Most High God because despite taking humanity and the nature of the Seed of Abraham, there was no sin to cause guilt and terror toward the future Judgment of Salvation/Rejection ( the Investigative Judgment ) .

Jesus Christ had no Intercessor for Himself, thus it was imperative that He perfectly feared God, for there was no one to add perfect righteousness to His prayers. His life and His prayers were already perfectly sinlessly righteous. Everything in the Bible telling of Him and quoting Him in red is a tutorial of what it means to Biblically Fear God, and examining His life and methods of living shows how to perfectly sinlessly righteously Biblically Fear God ourselves.

Biblically fearing God by obeying God no matter what - Genesis 18:19; Exodus 1:8-22; Deuteronomy 13:4; Judges 6:10; 1<sup>st</sup> Samuel 12:14; Isaiah 50:10; Daniel 3:1-30; Haggai 1:12; John 7:21-30; John 8:1-59 (notice **John 8: 29 Agape driven key concept** RE fearing God) intense continual conflict and controversy - notice **John 8: 55**; Acts 5:29; 2<sup>nd</sup> Corinthians 7:15; Colossians 3:22; Revelation 12:11.

- 3. What does Biblically Fearing God extend or offer from God's appointed Intercessor in Heaven, to the sinner? Psalms 5:7; Psalm 33:18-22; Luke 1:50; Exodus 20:6 (If a generation ='s 20 yrs ='s 20,000 years, if a generation ='s 40 years ='s 40,000 yrs of mercy); Deuteronomy 7:9; (psalms 5:7 & 33:18 & 103:11,17 & 147:11; Proverbs 16.6: Luke 1:50).
- <u>4.</u> <u>Why is mercy from God a salvation issue?</u> <u>Titus 3:5</u>- according to God's mercy He saves;

<u>Ephesians 4:32("for Christ's sake</u>"/ <Christ seeks many brethern - God wants to give Christ many brethern> Romans 8:29 as is written in Isaiah 53:11 + Genesis 49:26 suffered being seperated from His brethren {seperated from His brethern - made sin for us/trod winepress alone[/poured out [Christ witnessing & praising God among (Rev 7:9-10)for the great congregation which no man could number-Psalms 22 entire, Psalms 35:18, Psalms 40:9-10]} + Leviticus 25:48 Redeemer of His Brethren + Psalms 2:8 all the heathen for an inheritance that finally believes, knows, follows>);

<u>So why is mercy a salvation issue</u>- God for Christ's sake - for good or bad extends multiplied mercy to you what mercy you extend to others, Hebrews 5:1-10; notice verse 9; Luke 10:25-37; Matthew 7:2; Mark 4:24; Luke 6:37-38; Consider Zechariah chapter 9 verse by verse some are punished some rewarded notice verse 12.

**5.** Does Heaven recognize a person's honest efforts to Biblically Fear God (obey God) in sincerity and truth? Yes Heaven does immediately and has a scheduled system to add each so acting person to Heaven's intercession in their behalf. How are such obedient people located? 2<sup>nd</sup> Chronicles 16:9 tells how; God activly looks for such people with approval the first 2/3 of the verse that applies and shows the answer.

2<sup>nd</sup> Chronicles 16:9 For the <u>eyes of the LORD</u> run to and fro throughout the whole earth, <u>to</u> <u>shew himself strong in the behalf of them whose heart is perfect toward him.</u> <u>Hebrews</u> <u>6:10</u> For God is not unrighteous to forget your work and labour of love, which ye have shewed toward his name, <u>in that ye have</u> ministered to the saints, <u>and do</u> minister.

Each day at 3 PM the time of the evening Intercession work, by Jesus humanities High Priest, this is added to Heaven's official records and holy angels commissioned assignments. "Until the Even", - Leviticus 11: verses 24,25,27,28,31,32,39,40,46; Leviticus 15: verses

5,6,7,8,10,11,16, 17,18,19, 21,22,23,27; Leviticus 17:17; Numbers 19:7,8,10; (Temple Prayer-Solomon's prayer- 2<sup>nd</sup> Chronicles 6:37-42); Job 1:1-5 notice verse 5; Ezra 9:4 (Heaven appointed High Priest - morning evening > Hebrews 7:25; Hebrews 2:11 ) Do you notice what this High Priest up in Heaven is doing according to these texts?

- <u>6.</u> God has set up in Heaven His High Priest and given Him a staff to do His bidding, as He intercedes and makes atonement between people and situations being prayed for and according to Divine terms and conditions. Hebrews 7:25; Matthew 10:32. (The reader must ask themself and acknowledge) Do I fulfill these conditions by my thinking, speaking, living, what I give allegiance to, and who and what I trust and follow? (This appointed High Priest is also Judge; and is identified and named in Genesis 18:1-33; and the Book of Hebrews and John 5:22-30.)
- **7.** What conditions work against Heaven's voice of intercession and mercy; and if lasting long enough block this intercession? Mark 8:38; Matthew 10:33; 2<sup>nd</sup> Timothy 2:12; Titus 1:6; How do I day to day stand in Heaven's estimation of myself, and my life? (Do I really love others as Jesus loves me? 1<sup>st</sup> John 5:1-5 / 2<sup>nd</sup> John 1:9 / Jude 17-25 / Proverbs 24:17-20 / 1<sup>st</sup> John 1:1-through 1<sup>st</sup> John 2:1-12 / <toward Church brethren John 13:34-35> and < toward others in general John 15:7-17> ). 1<sup>st</sup> Corinthians chapter 12 & 13 + 1<sup>st</sup> John 4:8 + John 17:3 + James 1:1-27 + Sermon on the Mount + Exodus ch 20. Have I worked with or against heaven's intercession for ME?

### **8.** What and where and when is salvation made eternal security toward God and eternal life?

The parables of the lost sheep, the lost coin, the prodigal son, bring out in distinct lines God's pitying love for those who are erring and straying from Him. A sealed document or something or some one sealed closing up consideration regarding it or someone, preserving the completed contents as the owner desires.

Ezekiel 9:1-11 <08420> an invisible mark / seal / sign / representative name tag and citizenship ID Card for citizens of New Jerusalem. It encapsulates, identifies, armors, and signifies God's Truth and Character engrafted and what he stands for - implanted and retained rooted within. Humans can not see and read it, but God and Holy Angels can and do read it. It is the results of partnership with Christ Who seals His obedient symbolic holy-oil filled followers He has chosen during the Judgment when all lives are examined by Him as High Priest. This sealing is written about in the Old Testament > example <u>Isaiah 8:16</u> <02856> God's Law is His character and His sign / seal.

Reading and applying to one's self- <u>John 1:12; John 3:3-21; 2<sup>nd</sup> Peter 1:1-2;</u> <u>Sermon on the Mount; John ch's 3 and ch 17.</u> Vital Transfusion of Himself, When it is in the heart,
- **B.** <u>Cleansed</u> What Saul of Tarsus said as he was in process of becoming Paul > Acts 22:3-16, notice verse 16, follow verse 16 as result of surrender to Christ and obey verse 16 as result of that obedient surrender and Christ will cleanse you > 1<sup>st</sup> Peter 1:21-25; John 15:1-27; 1<sup>st</sup> John 1:1-10 notice verse 9. Christ is the sin bearing Saviour Who upon repentant humble request removes the guilt of sin and takes it upon Himself and once bearing it, transports and stores it up inside Heaven's Records of sin in the Heavenly Sanctuary. Thus as King of Kings Jesus returns at parousia (Second Coming) no longer as Sin Bearer and His reward is with Him >

salvation rewards & damnation rewards.

Which sins are shown in the Book of Hebrews and Sanctuary Service awaiting final processing during the blotting out of sins at the times of Refreshing, and the first phase placing of that remainder of guilt culpability on Satan during the two phase binding of Satan during the Seven Last Plagues and second phase marooning stranding a then flightless Satan on Earth at the Second Coming to await sentencing and execution of the sentence .

"The third angel's message is the proclamation of the commandments of God and the faith of Jesus Christ. The commandments of God have been proclaimed, but the faith of Jesus Christ has not been proclaimed by Seventh-day Adventists as <u>of equal importance</u>, <u>the law and the gospel going hand in hand</u>. - 11. Biblically Fearing God
- (A.) How deep can God implant Biblically Fearing God Fearing God like Jesus did and

<u>does, within a person?</u> It is a Partnership being implanted. (1<sup>st</sup> Samuel 9:27- through 1st Samuel 10:16 reread and notice ch 10:6) God filled Saul for a time with the Holy Spirit, and centuries later also changed Saul of Tarsus a murderous zealot into Paul the Apostle, who evangelized Asia Minor for Christ and wrote the bulk of the New Testament and died a martyr for Christ as an old man. What Job was like, and how Christ's disciples were developed into Christ's Apostles. This is an example of the depth of God's work in people

Partnership being daily implanted - Acts 5:32; John 8:29; John 17:23,26; >(2<sup>nd</sup> Corinthians 13:5; Galatians 4:19; John 14:17; Romans 8:10; Philippians 2:5; 2<sup>nd</sup> Peter1:1-12. Examine yourself daily to see if this is IN you, not just on you. Heaven's High Priest / Messiah / Intercessor seeks to internalize and engraft His copy of this living faith into you that is part of Himself unto and inside you.

(God's mission for you - "Love to man is the **earthward <u>manifestation</u>** of the love of God. **It was to implant this love, to make us children of one family**, that the King of glory became one with us. **(B.)** Why God commands you the reader to learn and do what is physically, mentally, emotionally, spiritually, Biblically Fearing Him NOW, despite it making you different from society and all other religions and Churches and Ideologies - The answer is in the texts / passages. Revelation 14:7 & Deuteronomy 7:9-11 KJV & Douay Bible Versions.

The answer is in the Text / Passage - in both KJV & Douay Bible versions

<u>God has no pleasure in the death of the wicked</u> (Ezekiel 18:32: Ezekiel 33:11), God wants everyone to repent so Jesus can intercede for them, mediate their pardon, and He (Father God is legally allowed to adopt them through Christ as His children in spirit and in truth. Loving obedience is opening the door allowing God to send the holy ghost/holy Spirit into and upon a person.

God wants all who truly know and biblically fearing him like Deuteronomy 10:12-13 says. Life under such happy conditions with all them loving Him obeying them trusting Him and themselves being counterparts of His own lovingness and obedience of His Law and truth and His trustworthy-ness; both on Earth and in Heaven.

Thus being safe children in Heaven who will never break His heart by rebellion and sin, walk with Him eternally growing the parent / child happy healthy safe family relationship, delighted in each others company world without end.

Unfortunately some people chose to serve Satan as their owner, master, ruler, king; and Satan's mission is to defile God's image and reputation, usurp His power and rule, depose Him from His throne, and kill Him. Satan implanted his law of sin and death into Adam and Eve, and it infects the mind and brain and body of all Adam's descendants. So God must seek to rescue humanity, but not all humanity wants rescued. There must be tests to reveal and discover who is who among humanity, so all observers may know and be settled in knowing for themselves.

All are sealed with the Seal of God > Those who privately and publically abide in Christ by Scriptures's teachings and Christ's Ethics and Morals inside and a life of prayer and obedient Agape love union with God sealed unto acceptance.

Those who refuse to abide in Christ and reject or disobey Scriptures's teachings and reject Christ's Ethics and Morals and retain and live by their own ethics morals and teachings or by culturally corrupted non-Biblical Ethics and Morals, viewing everything without Christ's offered light inside and a life of spotty and presumptuous prayers and disobedient self serving union with God's enemies fully display their chosen stance before God and people and get sealed with The Mark of Irrevocable Rebellion unto rejection.

Then the records of sins of the redeemed / accepted / chosen are blotted out from their records, and the rejected are irrevocably confirmed upon them. Thus Christ establishes the guilt or redeemed innocence of all individuals dead, or living, and their rewards according to their works - good or bad - before He returns. What is Salvation according to the Bible and Jesus's Testifying? It is Christ in You the Hope of Glory and Christ Ministering Heaven into you and You into Heaven.

Christ's Presence and prayer life inside you through His work in you and for you and through

you helping educating teaching others, and your engrafting His Teaching from the whole Bible.

You in partnership with Christ engrafting His Ethics and Morals, and Christ creating and developing union with Himself and Father God with-in you through the indwelling Holy Ghost/Holy Spirit that creates unconditional surrender to God and unconditional Agape Love built obedience to God through Scripture and the Rev 19:10 SOP. Christ sealing you unto Himself and mediating your completeness in Christ <a href="https://salvationathreesidedcoin.blogspot.com">https://salvationathreesidedcoin.blogspot.com</a>

Bible Biographies tell of the good and the bad, and demonstrate the need for the Pre-Advent Judgment where Christ examines all life histories while He is still High Priest in Heaven's sanctuary. Look at the case of Pharaoh in the days of the Exodus, the Pharaoh of the Red Sea.

"Every action, good or bad, prepares the way for its repetition. How was it in the case of Pharaoh? The statement in Holy Writ is that God hardened his heart, and at every repetition of light in the manifestation of God's power the statement is repeated. Every time he refused to submit to God's will his heart became harder and less impressible by the Spirit of God. He sowed the seed of obstinacy, and God left it to vegetate. He might have prevented it by a miracle, but that was not His plan. He allowed it to grow and produce a harvest of its own kind, thus, proving the truthfulness of the scripture: "Whatsoever a man soweth, that shall he also reap." When a man plants doubts, he will reap doubts. By rejecting the first light and every following ray, Pharaoh went from one degree of hardness of heart to another, until the cold, dead forms of the first-born only checked his unbelief and obstinacy for a moment. And then, determined not to yield to God's way, he continued his willful course until overwhelmed by the waters of the Red Sea. 5T p-119.2

"This case is placed on record for our benefit. Just what took place in Pharaoh's heart will take place in every soul that neglects to cherish the light and walk promptly in its rays. God destroys no one. The sinner destroys himself by his own impenitence. When a person once neglects to heed the invitations, reproofs, and warnings of the Spirit of God, his conscience becomes seared, and the next time he is admonished, it will be more difficult to yield obedience than before. And thus with every repetition. Conscience is the voice of God, heard amid the conflict of human passions; when it is resisted, the Spirit of God is grieved. 5T p-120.1

"We want all to understand how the soul is destroyed. It is not that God sends out a decree that man shall not be saved. He does not throw a darkness before the eyes which cannot be penetrated. But man at first resists a motion of the Spirit of God, and, having once resisted, it is less difficult to do so the second time, less the third, and far less the fourth. Then comes the harvest to be reaped from the seed of unbelief and resistance. Oh what a harvest of sinful indulgences is preparing for the sickle! 5T p-120.2

"When secret prayer and reading of the Scriptures are neglected today, tomorrow they can be omitted with less remonstrance of conscience. There will be a long list of omissions, all for a single grain sown in the soil of the heart. On the other hand, every ray of light cherished will yield a harvest of light. Temptation once resisted will give power to more firmly resist the second time; every new victory gained over self will smooth the way for higher and nobler triumphs. Every victory is a seed sown to eternal life. 5T 120.3

People choose everyday, often without much thought. God keeps records that touch the life and works and thoughts and intents of the heart compared to the light He daily sends to light up His safe path for them, despite their circumstances.

The Pre-Advent Investigative Judgement are the records of Christ daily sending what you need just as you need it, and your responses and receiving Him and His help, or rejecting.

A short list of Bible Texts talking about the Investigative Judgment showing from the Biblical Language that Revelation 14:7 is a perpetually ongoing Divine command to each individual reader which may not be emphasized so well in the English Language on the surface.

5657 TVM: Aorist 5777, passive Deponent 5789, Imperative 5794.

5777 Tense-Aorist the Aorist Tense is characterized by it's emphasis on punctiliar action: that is, the concept of the verb is considered without regard for past, present, future time. There is no direct or clear English equivalent for this tense, though it is generally rendered as a simple past tense in most translations.

5789 Voice -Passive Deponent The passive deponent forms in almost all cases are translated as being in the passive voice. See "Passive" 5786 Voice - Passive The passive voice represents the subject as being the recipient of the action. E.G., in the sentence, "the boy was hit by the ball," the boy receives the action.

5794 Mood - Imperative - The Imperative mood corresponds to the English imperative, <u>and expresses a command to the hearer to preform a certain action by the order and authority of the one commanding</u>. Thus, Jesus's phrase "Repent ye and believe the Gospel" in Mark 1:15 is not just an invitation, but an absolute command requiring full obedience on the part of all hearers. The ending of the 70 prophetic weeks or 490 literal years was a time of judgment for Judaism as an Ideology.

Revelation 14:6,7 speaks of a time of, Life Record Investigating Judgment for the portion of the human species that professes Christ and / or is lead by the Holy Spirit/Holy Ghost, if they had no opportunity to hear of Christ, but listen to Heaven lead and call them.

(Scripture foretells a time of a pure Biblically complete Gospel followed by the call and explanation to Biblically Fear God, reflect Christ's character, to learn to keep the Bible's ancient 7<sup>th</sup> Day Sabbath to properly worship Christ the Lord of Sabbath. Then the time of the investigative judgement is announced .) Fearing God is preparation for the Investigative Judgment that gives Christ opportunity to heal convert mediate atone minister salvation in behalf of those that Biblically fear Him from the response of Agape love He implants and inspires and awakens in them. Not so for those who deny Him by their works of disobedience.

The King in the Parable refers to the Bible's limited description of the judgement of salvation / rewards/ rejection / consequences in Daniel chapter 7: 9,10, 13, 14 This is The Most High God Who presides over the Judgment, and Jesus Christ the Son of God / Son of Man who is the Sacrificed Lamb, the High Priest, the Judge. The Day of Atonement / Investigative Pre-Advent Judgment is the marriage of Christ and all the individuals who come to Him and submit to Him ruling over them, they obey Christ, they learn of Him, emulate Him, learn by His example, and they imitate Him and His ways, His words and ethics and morals and Earthly prayer life they engraft so that those things become theirs under Christ's tutor-ship, they apply Scripture's conditions and promises to themselves like He did and still does. That is what Biblically Fearing God means.

When a person is baptized by immersion Scripture says they have put on Christ, their names entered into the Lamb's Book of Life, if by their persistent willful knowing disobedience their works deny Him to the point they must be removed from the Book of Life - forever; this is called having their name Blotted of God's Book, or out of the Lamb's Book of Life.

- 18 As for his father, because he cruelly oppressed, spoiled his brother by violence, and did that which is not good among his people, lo, even he shall die in his iniquity.
- 19 Yet say ye, Why? doth not the son bear the iniquity of the father? When the son hath done that which is lawful and right, and hath kept all my statutes, and hath done them, he shall surely live.
- <u>20 The soul that sinneth, it shall die</u>. The son shall not bear the iniquity of the father, neither shall the father bear the iniquity of the son: the righteousness of the righteous shall be upon him, and the wickedness of the wicked shall be upon him.
- 21 ¶ But if the wicked will turn from all his sins that he hath committed, and keep all my statutes, and do that which is lawful and right, he shall surely live, he shall not die.
- 22 All his transgressions that he hath committed, they shall not be mentioned unto him: in his righteousness that he hath done he shall live.
- 23 <u>Have I any pleasure at all that the wicked should die? saith the Lord GOD: and not that he should return from his ways, and live?</u>
- 24 <u>But when the righteous turneth away from his righteousness, and committeth iniquity, and doeth according to all the abominations that the wicked man doeth, shall he live? All his righteousness that he hath done shall not be mentioned: in his trespass that he hath trespassed, and in his sin that he hath sinned, in them shall he die.</u>
- 25 Yet ye say, The way of the Lord is not equal. Hear now, O house of Israel; Is not my way equal? are not your ways unequal?

- 26 When a righteous man turneth away from his righteousness, and committeth iniquity, and dieth in them; for his iniquity that he hath done shall he die.
- 27 <u>Again, when the wicked man turneth away from his wickedness that he hath committed, and doeth that which is lawful and right, he shall save his soul alive.</u>
- 28 Because he considereth, and turneth away from all his transgressions that he hath committed, he shall surely live, he shall not die.
- 29 Yet saith the house of Israel, The way of the Lord is not equal. O house of Israel, are not my ways equal? are not your ways unequal?
- 30 ¶ Therefore I will judge you, O house of Israel, <u>every one according to his ways, saith the Lord GOD.</u> Repent, and turn yourselves from all your transgressions; so iniquity shall <u>not be your ruin.</u>
- 31 <u>Cast away from you all your transgressions, whereby ye have transgressed; and make</u> you a new heart and a new spirit: for why will ye die. O house of Israel?
- 32 <u>For I have no pleasure in the death of him that dieth, saith the Lord GOD: wherefore turn yourselves, and live ye.</u>

**DRA-** Ezekiel 18:3-32

- 3 As I live, saith the Lord God, this parable shall be no more to you a proverb in Israel.
- 4 Behold all souls are mine: as the soul of the father, so also the soul of the son is mine: the soul that sinneth, the same shall die.
- 5 And if a man be just, and do judgment and justice,
- 6 And hath not eaten upon the mountains, nor lifted up his eyes to the idols of the house of Israel: and hath not defiled his neighbour's wife, nor come near to a menstruous woman:
- 7 And hath not wronged any man: but hath restored the pledge to the debtor, hath taken nothing away by violence: hath given his bread to the hungry, and hath covered the naked with a garment:
- 8 Hath not lent upon usury, nor taken any increase: hath withdrawn his hand from iniquity, and hath executed true judgment between man and man:
- 9 Hath walked in my commandments, and kept my judgments, to do truth: he is just, he shall surely live, saith the Lord God.
- 10 And if he beget a son that is a robber, a shedder of blood, and that hath done some one of these things:
- 11 Though he doth not all these things, but that eateth upon the mountains, and that defileth his neighbour's wife:

- 12 That grieveth the needy and the poor, that taketh away by violence, that restoreth not the pledge, and that lifteth up his eyes to idols, that committeth abomination:
- 13 That giveth upon usury, and that taketh an increase: shall such a one live? he shall not live. Seeing he hath done all these detestable things, he shall surely die, his blood shall be upon him.
- 14 But if he beget a son, who, seeing all his father's sins, which he hath done, is afraid, and shall not do the like to them:
- 15 That hath not eaten upon the mountains, nor lifted up his eyes to the idols of the house of Israel, and hath not defiled his neighbour's wife:
- 16 And hath not grieved any man, nor withholden the pledge, nor taken away with violence, but hath given his bread to the hungry, and covered the naked with a garment:
- 17 That hath turned away his hand from injuring the poor, hath not taken usury and increase, but hath executed my judgments, and hath walked in my commandments: this man shall not die for the iniquity of his father, but living he shall live.
- 18 As for his father, because he oppressed and offered violence to his brother, and wrought evil in the midst of his people, behold he is dead in his own iniquity.
- 19 And you say: Why hath not the son borne the iniquity of his father? Verily, because the son hath wrought judgment and justice, hath kept all my commandments, and done them, living, he shall live.
- 20 The soul that sinneth, the same shall die: the son shall not bear the iniquity of the father, and the father shall not bear the iniquity of the son: the justice of the just shall be upon him, and the wickedness of the wicked shall be upon him.
- 21 But if the wicked do penance for all his sins which he hath committed, and keep all my commandments, and do judgment, and justice, living he shall live, and shall not die.
- 22 I will not remember all his iniquities that he hath done: in his justice which he hath wrought, he shall live.
- 23 Is it my will that a sinner should die, saith the Lord God, and not that he should be converted from his ways, and live?
- 24 But if the just man turn himself away from his justice, and do iniquity according to all the abominations which the wicked man useth to work, shall he live? all his justices which he hath done, shall not be remembered: in the prevarication, by which he hath prevaricated, and in his

sin, which he hath committed, in them he shall die.

- 25 And you have said: The way of the Lord is not right. Hear ye, therefore, O house of Israel: Is it my way that is not right, and are not rather your ways perverse?
- 26 For when the just turneth himself away from his justice, and committeth iniquity, he shall die therein: in the injustice that he hath wrought he shall die.
- 27 And when the wicked turneth himself away from his wickedness, which he hath wrought, and doeth judgment, and justice: he shall save his soul alive.
- 28 Because he considereth and turneth away himself from all his iniquities which he hath wrought, he shall surely live, and not die.
- 29 And the children of Israel say: The way of the Lord is not right. Are not my ways right, O house of Israel, and are not rather your ways perverse?
- 30 Therefore will I judge every man according to his ways, O house of Israel, saith the Lord God. Be converted, and do penance for all your iniquities: and iniquity shall not be your ruin.
- 31 Cast away from you all your transgressions, by which you have transgressed, and make to yourselves a new heart, and a new spirit: and why will you die, O house of Israel?
- 32 For I desire not the death of him that dieth, saith the Lord God, return ye and live.

#### **KJV- Ezekiel 33: 1-20**

- 1 ¶ Again the word of the LORD came unto me, saying,
- 2 Son of man, speak to the children of thy people, and say unto them, When I bring the sword upon a land, if the people of the land take a man of their coasts, and set him for their watchman:
- 3 If when he seeth the sword come upon the land, he blow the trumpet, and warn the people;
- 4 Then whosoever heareth the sound of the trumpet, and taketh not warning; if the sword come, and take him away, his blood shall be upon his own head.
- 5 He heard the sound of the trumpet, and took not warning; his blood shall be upon him. But he that taketh warning shall deliver his soul.
- 6 But if the watchman see the sword come, and blow not the trumpet, and the people be not warned; if the sword come, and take any person from among them, he is taken away in his iniquity; **but his blood will I require at the watchman's hand.**
- 7 So thou, O son of man, I have set thee a watchman unto the house of Israel; therefore thou shalt hear the word at my mouth, and warn them from me.
- 8 When I say unto the wicked, O wicked man, thou shalt surely die; if thou dost not speak to warn the wicked from his way, that wicked man shall die in his iniquity; but his blood will I

require at thine hand.

- 9 Nevertheless, if thou warn the wicked of his way to turn from it; if he do not turn from his way, he shall die in his iniquity; but thou hast delivered thy soul.
- 10 ¶ Therefore, O thou son of man, speak unto the house of Israel; Thus ye speak, saying, If our transgressions and our sins be upon us, and we pine away in them, how should we then live?
- 11 Say unto them, As I live, saith the Lord GOD, I have no pleasure in the death of the wicked; but that the wicked turn from his way and live: turn ye, turn ye from your evil ways; for why will ye die, O house of Israel?
- 12 Therefore, thou son of man, say unto the children of thy people, The righteousness of the righteous shall not deliver him in the day of his transgression: as for the wickedness of the wicked, he shall not fall thereby in the day that he turneth from his wickedness; neither shall the righteous be able to live for his righteousness in the day that he sinneth.
- 13 <u>When I shall say to the righteous, that he shall surely live; if he trust to his own righteousness, and commit iniquity, all his righteousnesses shall not be remembered; but for his iniquity that he hath committed, he shall die for it.</u>
- 14 Again, when I say unto the wicked, Thou shalt surely die; if he turn from his sin, and do that which is lawful and right;
- 15 If the wicked restore the pledge, give again that he had robbed, walk in the statutes of life, without committing iniquity; he shall surely live, he shall not die.
- 16 None of his sins that he hath committed shall be mentioned unto him: he hath done that which is lawful and right; he shall surely live.
- 17 Yet the children of thy people say, The way of the Lord is not equal: but as for them, their way is not equal.
- 18 When the righteous turneth from his righteousness, and committeth iniquity, he shall even die thereby.
- 19 But if the wicked turn from his wickedness, and do that which is lawful and right, he shall live thereby.
- 20 Yet ye say, The way of the Lord is not equal. O ye house of Israel, I will judge you every one after his ways.

DRA- Ezekiel 33:1-20

- 1 And the word of the Lord came to me, saying:
- 2 Son of man, speak to the children of thy people, and say to them: When I bring the sword upon a land, if the people of the land take a man, one of their meanest, and make him a watchman over them:
- 3 And he see the sword coming upon the land, and sound the trumpet, and tell the people:
- 4 Then he that heareth the sound of the trumpet, whosoever he be, and doth not look to himself, if the sword come, and cut him off: his blood shall be upon his own head.

- 5 He heard the sound of the trumpet and did not look to himself, his blood shall be upon him: but if he look to himself, he shall save his life.
- 6 And if the watchman see the sword coming, and sound not the trumpet: and the people look not to themselves, and the sword come, and cut off a soul from among them: he indeed is taken away in his iniquity, but I will require his blood at the hand of the watchman.
- 7 So thou, O son of man, I have made thee a watchman to the house of Israel: therefore thou shalt hear the word from my mouth, and shalt tell it them from me.
- 8 When I say to the wicked: O wicked man, thou shalt surely die: if thou dost not speak to warn the wicked man from his way: that wicked man shall die in his iniquity, but I will require his blood at thy hand.
- 9 But if thou tell the wicked man, that he may be converted from his ways, and he be not converted from his way: he shall die in his iniquity: but thou hast delivered thy soul.
- 10 Thou therefore, O son of man, say to the house of Israel: Thus you have spoken, saying: Our iniquities, and our sins are upon us, and we pine away in them: how then can we live?
- 11 Say to them: As I live, saith the Lord God, I desire not the death of the wicked, but that the wicked turn from his way, and live. Turn ye, turn ye from your evil ways: and why will you die, O house of Israel?
- 12 Thou therefore, O son of man, say to the children of thy people: The justice of the just shall not deliver him, in what day soever he shall sin: and the wickedness of the wicked shall not hurt him, in what day soever he shall turn from his wickedness: and the just shall not be able to live in his justice, in what day soever he shall sin.
- 13 Yea, if I shall say to the just that he shall surely live, and he, trusting in his justice, commit iniquity: all his justices shall be forgotten, and in his iniquity, which he hath committed, in the same shall he die.
- 14 And if I shall say to the wicked: Thou shalt surely die: and he do penance for his sin, and do judgment and justice,
- 15 And if that wicked man restore the pledge, and render what he had robbed, and walk in the commandments of life, and do no unjust thing: he shall surely live, and shall not die.
- 16 None of his sins, which he hath committed, shall be imputed to him: he hath done judgment and justice, he shall surely live.

- 17 And the children of thy people have said: The way of the Lord is not equitable: whereas their own way is unjust.
- 18 For when the just shall depart from his justice, and commit iniquities, he shall die in them.
- 19 And when the wicked shall depart from his wickedness, and shall do judgments, and justice: he shall live in them.
- 20 And you say: The way of the Lord is not right, I will judge every one of you according to his ways, O house of Israel.

Heaven to reach down by the Holy Ghost and circumcise your heart? Thus daily filling you with His perfected Divine / Human Love, to obey God and get as close as possible to God each day and imitating God's ways (Biblically Fearing God).

KJV- Deuteronomy 30: 6 And the LORD thy God will circumcise thine heart, and the heart of thy seed, to love the LORD thy God with all thine heart, and with all thy soul, that thou mayest live.

DRA- Deuteronomy 30: 6 The Lord thy God will circumcise thy heart, and the heart of thy seed: that then mayst love the Lord thy God with all thy heart and with all thy soul, that thou mayst live.
